The Division of Parole and Probation is conducting a pre-sentence investigation on the above-named defendant. It is our understanding that you and/or your child are a victim of this crime. As part of our investigation, we attempt to determine: (1) What loss or expenses you suffered as a result of this crime; and (2) How you were affected by the crime itself. Information obtained during the investigation is the basis for a report that will assist the Judge for the purpose of sentencing.

The sentencing court must order the offender to pay restitution to you if you suffered a monetary loss as a result of their crime. The Division is requesting you return the attached questionnaire as soon as possible, **and provide documentation verifying your loss, if available, for consideration of restitution.** If your child has suffered a financial loss as a result of this crime, restitution can be ordered for damage or loss of property, and medical, psychological or dental treatment if related to the defendant's criminal conduct.

If restitution is not an issue, a Victim Impact Statement explaining how the crime has affected you and your immediate family is still requested. A separate statement is also provided so that your child can offer his/her thoughts as well. [NRS 176.015 §3](#) requires the court allow a victim, or their representative, to be heard prior to sentencing, opinions on the crime, perpetrator, the offense impact or need for restitution may be expressed. If you wish to address the court, you must contact the District Attorney's Office, _____, to arrange for your appearance.

The State of Nevada and the Division of Parole and Probation has included a free anonymous and confidential resource link available to the victim(s) 24 hours a day by phone or via internet to help the victim (s) be notified when the defendant has been released, transferred, escaped or has a court date/appearance. To register call toll free 1-888-268-8463. The services are available via the internet at www.vineline.com and then follow the instructions to register.

As a victim you are entitled to certain rights which are outlined in Marsy's Law Declaration of Rights. They can be accessed at the Division of Parole and Probation website [Victims' Bill of Rights](http://npp.dps.nv.gov/Home/Resources/Victim_s_BOR) (http://npp.dps.nv.gov/Home/Resources/Victim_s_BOR) page.

The State of Nevada has funds available to qualifying victims for compensation for injury, loss or counseling. For additional information, contact the District Attorney's Office. Please return your completed Victim Questionnaire and Victim Impact Statement(s) **within 10 days.** The Division is aware that navigating the criminal justice system can be a confusing, frustrating process, and appreciates your assistance.

Was your child physically injured or hurt as a result of this crime? If yes, you may wish to write about the type of injuries your child had, what medical treatment your child received, and how long these injuries lasted or are expected to last. Please use additional paper as necessary.

Has this crime affected the way your child relates to his or her friends, either at school or in your neighborhood? Has this crime affected your child's school work in any way? Please use additional paper as necessary.

How has this crime affected you, your family and those close to your child? You may wish to write about changes that may have occurred in your family, in your ability to perform your work, make a living, run a household or enjoy any other activities you enjoyed before the crime. You may also wish to include any victim services or counseling that you and those close to your child have received. Please use additional paper as necessary.

If your child is just learning to read, help your child fill out the victim impact statement. When helping your child, read the directions aloud to your child, talk about what feelings are (happy, sad, mad, scared, or any other feelings you think are appropriate), and what your child may want to think about when they are drawing or writing on the statement. Please do not tell your child what to draw or write. This is your child's chance to tell the judge how he or she is feeling about what has happened. If your child would rather draw a picture of a bird, a boat, or write a story about bumblebees, this is okay. Should your child become uncomfortable in any way while filling out the victim impact statement, reassure your child that he or she does not have to fill out the form unless he or she wants to.
